Adopted: November 6, 2017

TREE CUTTING & BRUSH CHIPPING POLICY

The City will maintain trees on public right-of-way

- To include removal of dead trees and trimming as needed
- Removal of live trees on public right-of-way is discouraged
- If a property owner requires trees to be removed for their benefit the following policy applies

The City will chip up to 4" diameter, all brush and tree branches placed butt first either curbside or along the alley.

There will be no charge for chipping and removal of normal yard waste and tree trimming material. However, the property owner will be billed \$60.00 per hour for chipping and removal of material from "trees" that have been removed with a minimum charge of \$60.00.

In areas of new development, the City will not be responsible for clearing operations. The City will chip material up to 4" diameter associated with clearing operations placed butt first at curbside. The property owner will be billed \$120.00 per hour for chipping and removal of material associated with clearing operations with a minimum charge of \$120.00. After the house has been constructed, services will be provided consistent with this policy.

Trees affecting power lines will be trimmed or removed by the Utility with the understanding that private service wires are of less concern than primary distribution wires. The Director of Public Works will determine the extent of concern and whether removal or trimming is appropriate.

It should be understood that this policy may not cover all situations and in the event of gray areas, the Director of Public Works will make a determination as to what is appropriate.

Motion by Alder Barbara Bell to approve updated Tree Cutting & Brush Chipping Policy as presented. Policy provides for an increase from a minimum of \$25.00 per hour to \$60.00 per hour for residential chipping and removal and provides for a minimum of \$120.00 per hour for chipping and removal of material associated with clearing operations in areas of new development. Motion seconded by Alder Nancy Sanger. Motion carried.

Motion by Alder Gary Kjos to approve advertising to fill a Street Department laborer/truck driver position caused by the approaching retirement of Keith Dilley. Applications are to be received by December 1, 2017. Motion seconded by Alder Sara Strang. Motion carried.

Motion by Alder Milton Cashman to approve 10-Year Capital Improvement Plan as presented. It was noted that changes can be made to the plan as warranted. Motion seconded by Alder Barbara Bell. Motion carried.
